39 Gayle Cook, City Manager, gave a presentation explaining what a CIP is, how it is funded,
40 current park projects listed and new proposed park projects for OST committee input prior to
41 bringing CIP recommendations to City Council for approval. Presentation shown in

43 **4.3 Update and report on various Seabrook Park items, including needed repairs, signage,**
44 **plants, flowers and vegetation, and park use matters. Committee**

45 Member Jones mentioned:

- 46 • Carothers Community Garden has submitted a Grant application for \$9,600
- 47 • Carothers Community Garden host various garden classes. They are looking forward
48 to Rock painting with Seabrook Rocks. The class will be taught by rock painter,
49 Laura Harris.
- 50 • 25' treated wood pilings have been located and have been confirmed to be free and
51 available. Weber confirmed that the pilings were not theirs. TXDOT responded that
52 the pilings will not be used and anyone is welcome to have them. There are about 500
53 wood pilings near the Kemah/Seabrook Bridge. Member Jones will share email
54 contact with the City.
- 55 • Wi-Fi not available at Carothers Community Garden. Brian Craig, City
56 Engineer/Asst. Public Works Director, will follow up with IT Department on status.
- 57 • Carothers Community Garden will host a Work Party BBQ on the first Saturday of
58 May with City Council and staff invited.
- 59 • Discussed new Open Space and Trails Facebook page providing updates on OST
60 discussions and activities as well as find volunteers for OST projects. Brian Craig,
61 City Engineer/Asst. Public Works Director, recommended there be a link to City
62 website to the volunteer tab for people to sign up to volunteer. This would address
63 liability concerns.

64 Chair Antrobus mentioned:

- 65 • Pine Gully Park near the parking lot has four tallow trees that should be removed.
66 She can mark them to identify which should be removed.

67 Member Jackson mentioned:

- 68 • Hester Butterfly Garden cleanup will have red ribbons marking the plants to save and
69 not remove. The McCartney Rose should be removed.


81 The next Open Space & Trails meeting will be held tentatively on June 2, 2022 at 5 PM.


