- 43 • Requested clarification on recipients of the internal Park Maintenance email. Kevin
44 Padgett, Public Works Director, confirmed the recipients are Sean Landis, Brian
45 Craig, Saul Garcia, Natalie Stephens and himself.

46 Member Jackson:

- 47 • The mulch at Hester Garden has been spread out within the flowerbeds. At this time,
48 the Girls Scouts are in need of dirt and plants. Kevin Padgett, Public Works
49 Director, discussed the typical process for Scouts to propose a project to staff. The
50 Scouts will meet with staff to review and agree on proposal details. The Scouts then
51 return to their group to determine what fundraising, volunteers and resources will be
52 needed. The finalized plan is then submitted to staff, defining organization's and
53 staff's role in the project. Member Jackson will work with Scouts and staff to provide
54 scope of the project with timeline and delivery information. Scout group would like
55 to adopt and maintain the Hester Butterfly Garden.

73 near gazebo, and Bayside Park near the gazebo.


