



PROCLAMATION NATIONAL COLONIAL HERITAGE MONTH

WHEREAS, the First Assembly in Jamestown, Virginia was held in 1619 and was the foundation of the legislative branch of government, and in 2019 the National Society of Colonial Dames XVII Century celebrating the 400th anniversary of the beginning of Representative Government in America; and
